## **NOTABLE CASES**

### **R v BF – Conspiracy to supply drugs**

Defending in a multiple-defendant five-week conspiracy trial. This defendant acquitted on all counts. Other defendants later received up to 13 years' imprisonment

#### **Rv JM - Sexual Assault**

Defending an allegation of sexual assault in the workplace.

#### R v JR - Rape

Defending an allegation of rape. Issue of consent.

#### R v EL - s18 Wounding

Defending a woman conclusively found to have been the victim of trafficking. Successfully persuading the Crown that the allegations were not made out and that proceedings were not in the public interest

#### **R v TR – Armed Robbery**

Defending a man charged with robbery of a petrol station with a firearm. Five-day trial.

## **R v GS – Inciting Sexual Exploitation of a Child**

Complex legal argument advanced that police had acted consistent with entrapment of the defendant.
