2021/2022

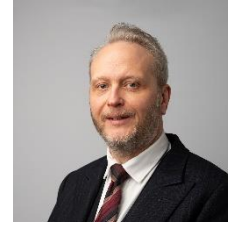
Represented the Local Authority in a 10-week final hearing in which other parties were represented by Queen's Counsel. This matter involved complex allegations of physical and sexual abuse.
